COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will target students' growth in the areas of reading, writing, listening, speaking, discussion, reflection, and viewing. Reading strategies, critical thinking skills, and vocabulary building comprise the main elements of reading instructions. Through fiction, nonfiction, and poetry reading, students will practice reading strategies and comprehension skills. The focus of writing will be on narrative, informational, and argumentative writing. The overall goal of the class is to increase the literacy and writing ability of students.

- Develop and increase reading fluency for comprehension
- Increase vocabulary knowledge and analyze a wide variety of literary terms
- To use higher order/critical thinking skills
- Respond to literature and effectively communicate through speech and writing

Honors and AP

Honors and AP courses challenge and enrich motivated college-bound students to expand their education beyond the typical secondary program. Honors and AP coursework develops advanced skills and provides the content background to prepare students for the college level work in Advanced Placement (AP) courses and on AP exams. Success requires student commitment to the expectations of the Honors and AP program. Students will be expected to:

- Learn, analyze, synthesize, and manipulate knowledge and skills; think critically;
- Budget time effectively and efficiently: expect homework daily per course;
- Develop effective study skills;
- Develop advanced content area vocabulary;
- Utilize community and industry resources;
- Write using the different modes: narrative, imaginative, expository, and persuasive
- Develop multi-media and oral presentation skills; and
- Maintain a passing grade of 70. A 60% grade for UIL eligibility does not constitute a passing grade for Honors and AP.

Classroom Rules:

- 1. Be on time.
- 2. Be prepared.
- 3. Respect others and property.
- 4. Stay on task and be focused.
- 5. Follow campus dress code guidelines.

Procedures:

- 1. Walk in quietly and sit on assigned seat quietly.

Accelerated Reader Program and Goals

- Every student will participate in our Accelerated Reading Program. The focus of this program is to increase fluency, enhance comprehension, and foster a love for reading. Students will be required to AR Test every two weeks on our scheduled library day.

Attendance:

Prompt and regular attendance is expected. *Students who are absent are responsible for asking the teacher for their missed work*, completing it, and turning it in within 2 days after returning. (Extended absences will be given more days accordingly.)

Class work/Late Work:

All class work should be complete, neat, and turned in when assigned.

Late work will **NOT** be accepted unless a Late Slip has been filled out by the student and signed by a parent or legal guardian. Late assignments will earn a grade not higher than a 70. Late assignments will be accepted until the end of the six week period.

Academic Dishonesty: Students caught cheating will be given a zero.

Extra Credit Work: Students will be provide opportunities for extra credit in after school tutorial.

Restroom Policy:

Students must go to the restroom in between classes. However, *in cases of emergencies, they will be allowed to go during independent work time*, one student at a time. Students must sign "Log Book" and borrow the teacher pass in order to exit classroom. Students are expected to return promptly to class.

Tardy Policy:
